

## Protect Your Watershed

If you live in the Salt Lake Valley, there's a good chance that a portion of your drinking water supply comes from the creek that flows through Affleck Park Campground. Human activity can have far reaching impacts on our drinking water quality. While some areas that supply drinking water in America have been closed to the public because of pollution, areas like Affleck Park Campground and Parleys Canyon have remained open while maintaining a pristine water supply because of careful stewardship. Other protected watersheds include City Creek Canyon, Big Cottonwood Canyon, Little Cottonwood Canyon and beyond. You can make a positive contribution to our water quality by following these simple watershed regulations:



Swimming and wading in the stream is prohibited. No washing clothes or dishes. Waders are required when fishing in streams.



Camping is by reservation only. Please visit [www.keepitpure.com](http://www.keepitpure.com) to make a reservation.



Please keep your drinking water supply clean by using restrooms.



Throw all garbage in provided garbage cans or pack it out. Do not use the fire pit as a trash can.



Dogs, horses, and other domestic animals are strictly prohibited, even if they remain in a vehicle.



Campfires are allowed in developed facilities with fire rings or within barbecue grills. Do not leave campfires unattended. Seasonal fire restrictions may apply. Fireworks are prohibited. Please bring your own firewood.



Off-road vehicles are not allowed in Affleck Park and Mountain Dell Canyon.



Parking allowed in designated spots only. No parking on vegetation.



Discharge of firearms, target practice and hunting are not allowed in the campground.

### Reservations

Reservations required to camp in Affleck Park. Reservations are online only. Reservations are taken starting the first Monday of March. After that, reservations may be made up to one day in advance 24 hours a day online. Open 7 days a week for the summer season.

#### Campsites

- Price \$15/night.
- Capacity: 8 people and 2 cars allowed per site.
- Trailers not allowed.
- Non trailer recreational vehicles allowed up to 25' in length.
- No potable water at campground.
